Drug and Alcohol Interagency Strategic Framework for Western Australia 2011-2015

DEPARTMENT OF THE ATTORNEY GENERAL ANNUAL REPORT 2013/14

In support of the *Drug and Alcohol Interagency Strategic Framework for Western Australia 2011-2015*, and to address a range of existing and emerging alcohol and other drug issues, the Department of the Attorney General has identified a number of key initiatives for 2013/14. Outcomes are summarised below in the respective key strategic areas of the Framework.

Key Strategy Area 1: Intervening before problems become entrenched

Implementing a range of programs and services that identify individuals, families and communities at-risk and intervening before problems become entrenched.

Highlights for 2013/14:

- Continued operation and support of the Perth Children's Court Drug Court incorporating the Youth Supervised Treatment Intervention Regime (YSTIR);
- Continued promotion of, and support for, the Presentence Opportunity Program (POP) as an early intervention for offenders who have emerging drug related problems; and
- Assisted with the implementation and ongoing delivery of the extension of POP to include offenders who are experiencing alcohol related problems within the metropolitan area.

Key Strategy Area 2: Effective treatment and support services

Providing integrated, evidence based treatment and support services that promote positive and healthy lifestyle changes by effectively responding to an individual's use and those affected by someone else's use.

Highlights for 2013/14:

- Ongoing and continued support for the delivery of the WA Diversion Program (POP/ YSTIR/ STIR/IDP) throughout the Magistrates Court of Western Australia;
- Ongoing and continued support for the Perth Drug Court and the Perth Children's Court Drug Court in providing access to intensive treatment regimes for offenders with serious drug related problems;
- Continued to engage justice stakeholders in promoting the WA Diversion Program; and
- Continued to foster opportunities for drug treatment programs to be available within other specialist courts such as the START Court and Family Violence Courts.

Key Strategy Area 3: Strategic coordination and capacity building

Providing improved and targeted responses to alcohol and other drug related problems through capacity building, workforce development, collaboration, and evidence based practice, monitoring and information dissemination.

Highlights for 2013/14:

- Continued to deliver the POP Program within Family Violence Courts as well as the STIR Program at selected Family Violence Courts;
- Continued the delivery of Aboriginal Justice Program Open Days throughout the north of Western Australia;
- Continued to administer the Property Confiscation Grants Program which provides support for targeted activities designed to prevent or reduce drug related problems; and
- Continued to support the Drug and Alcohol Interagency Strategic Framework for Western Australia 2011-15
